Treasurer's Report: No formal Treasure report.

Queen City Rowing has rented the Center in the past and has expressed interest in renting the Center for more meetings and special events in the future.

In effort to help the area to continue to look nice at I-275 and Kellogg Avenue, Anderson Township has taken over the grass mowing from the ODOT.

Acknowledgement and thanks were given again to Kim Leist for her continued hard work with cleaning up the areas around the California signs on Kellogg at each end of town. Thanks to Kim, these signs are also being painted. Some existing plants were overgrown and some in bad shape.

New plantings will be planted in the Spring.

Gary Osterfeld to hold Open House at The Sanctuary at River Green at the end of Renslar Avenue September 24th thru the 26th, and again October 1st thru the 3rd.

Christina Goehrig with Pig Candy, who has prior experience with the Columbia Tusculum Street Fest, is checking into what steps are needed for a festival in our neighborhood next year. Different locations in town were discussed as to where the festival could be held.

With no further business before the council, a motion to adjourn was made by Mike Christ seconded by Doug Masters, motion passed. The meeting was adjourned.
