California History Letter

I have a letter from July 2I, 1969 sent to Mrs. Elizabeth Cramer, 5841 Croslin St. from the Cinti. Enquirer.

Mrs. Cramer, the history of California, Ohio, is rather sketchy--it was never incorporated and existed on a community basis since its inception in 1859. Three men, Joseph Guthrie, John Brown, and Thomas Murdock, conceived a plan for a city that would "rival the California Gold Rush", expecting it to become the greatest town on the Ohio River.

they laid out a plan for sale of lots that would bring them wealth. Nothing happened, and the place remained a group of small houses around Eldorado, Second and Richmond Streets for many years.

The first settler was Christian Ebersole, who arrived from Hagerstown, Maryland, via Bourbon County, Ky., in 1802. He and his descendants are buried in the old Mt. Washington Cemetery.

The first financial institution was the California Building & Savings, Assn. in 1871. St. Jerome's Catholic Church was founde4d a short time previously. Never incorporated, California became a part of Cincinnati early in the Century. Hope this description ""fills the bill". Cordially, Dwight L. Bicknell

Property Owner / Developer Describes Project

At March's meeting of the California Community Council, Gary Osterfeld explained his intentions at Panama and Renslar. He would like to build high end single family residences with river views and access, similar to the configuration on the sign at his property, although he did say that may change somewhat. In order to be able to build he needed to raise the grade a few feet, above the river fringe level. He will still need to raise the habitable portions of the buildings up above the 100 year flood plane. This will likely be done with first floor garages.

Gary indicated that he has all required permits for the filling and the city inspectors are now watching closely to insure he is performing his work in compliance with the required regulations. An effort is underway to ensure that neighborhood streets that have been damaged by the truck traffic are repaired. As of this writing, he indicated that he is substantially complete with the fill work. He said there may be some additional periodically in smaller amounts.

He will likely not build anytime soon, but he is very excited to be a part of California and he wants to be a good neighbor and help to improve to the community. The City of Cincinnati departments are aware of the issues and are helping as much as possible to negate negative aspects and making sure the work is being done in accordance within regulations.
