INTERESTING FACT ABOUT CALIFORNIA

Over the years the Mt. Washington Press had a few history writers and I was able to attain many of them. Arnold Nichols was one of the earlier historians with his articles "BEYOND YESTERDAY"

This particular article was about THE OLD CLOUGH BAPTIST CHURCH one of the early places of worship in Anderson Township on Clough Pk. near Bridges Ln.

The walls were constructed of two widths of creek stones taken from the nearby Clough Creek. The stones on the outside were cemented with concrete or plaster, while those on the inside were cemented with mud. Some

years later the church was abandoned by the congregation, the roof collapsed. When the roof was gone the rain melted the mud, and the single pile of stone on the outside could not stand alone. Then the walls disintegrated, leaving loose stones on the ground. The church burial ground was there then but not sure if accessible anymore, cannot see anything from the road.

Some years after the Clough Baptist Church had fallen into disrepair, the CALIFORNIA METHODIST CHURCH requested and was given permission to remove the fallen wall stones, and they now live a second life as the façade of our little CALIFORNIA METHODIST CHURCH on Kellogg Ave. BAPTIST STONES NOW METHODIST STONES.

Benjamin Franklin Harmon was an early Baptist pastor in the area. He had been a minister at Columbia (East End). He established the Mt. Washington Baptist Church in 1866, the congregation built the fine brick building that was on the west side of Sutton opposite Plymouth Ave. The church prospered as long as Reverend Harmon was minister, not long after his death it was abandoned.

THE CLOUGH BAPTIST STONES CAN STILL BE ADMIRER AS YOU PASS THE CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY METHODIST CHURCH on Kellogg and Renstar Ave. in California. The church was built in 1953 and still very much active.

March 10, 2015

The meeting opened at 7:30 PM with President Dave Ross leading the pledge of allegiance to the flag. Roll call of officers indicated that Kathleen Chandler and Mike Christ were not present for the meeting. There were eleven members and eleven guests at the meeting. The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted by a motion made by Jo Shepherd and seconded by Jackie Frazier. The treasurer's report was approved by a motion made by Diana Weir and seconded by Debbie Glutz.

Guests

The police report was given by Officer Germaine Love. California incurred one reported offence for the month of February. She reported that District 2 has five new officers from the recent recruit class.

The fire report was given by firefighter Jon Davis. He was not able to determine the number of runs to California specifically. The statistics he has reflect the number of runs to all neighborhoods serviced by the Lunken firehouse. He mentioned that in March we should be aware of replacing smoke detectors that are more than ten years and with the change in the time, we should make sure to replace the batteries in our detectors. It was also mentioned that with the river levels being what they are and near flood stage, it is important to be flood smart and not drive on flooded roadways.

Vice-mayor David Mann was present for our meeting. He discussed the recent new trash policy, the fact that there are now more police officers on the streets, that the city budget is balanced for the first time in years, a discussion on bike trails and that in his opinion the NSP funding should be increased back to the \$10,000 that it used to be. He asked that we send him the details of the NSP funded project that we are most proud of. WE appreciate his concern and efforts as the Chair of Neighborhood Support. Mr. Mann also made comments regarding the conditions of many of the city's streets. The city has fallen behind on infrastructure due to a decrease in earnings and that there is a line item in the budget for street repairs.

Dennis Loochok from the city transportation engineering department was present to discuss the recent change made to Linneman Street. The street was signed to be a one-way street. He apologized for the lack of communication to the council and listened to the concerns of residents and property owners since the change occurred. We do realize it is a narrow street, but many of the streets in California are just as narrow. There was concern about traffic wanting to go from the ballpark and ballroom to Eldorado to access Kellogg at the light. Diane Havey-Pangallo made a motion that the street be returned to its normal two way operation, seconded by Diana Weir. Motion passed. Dave will send a letter to the city reflecting our opinion.

New/Old Business

A request was received by a city department to resolve an overlap of the boundaries of California and Mt. Washington. A representative of Mt. Washington Community Council will attend April meeting to discuss.

Dave Ross made a motion, seconded by Jackie Frazier, to hire the following for NSP/NBD projects for this year:

Dave mentioned to Mr. Mann that with the new fiscal year (July-July) makes projects in warm weather difficult to accomplish. Mr. Mann so noted.

Jo shepherd mentioned that a call to CRC maintenance needs to be made as the leak in the front corner of Ebersole has reoccurred.

Jackie Frazier mentioned that the flag at the Coney sign is tattered and needs replacement. It will be addressed.

With no further business before the council, the meeting was adjourned by a motion made by David Thiem and seconded by Jo Shepherd.

February 10, 2015

The meeting opened at 7:30 pm with President Dave Ross leading the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Roll call indicated that David Thiem, Kathleen Chandler, Mike Christ and Jo Shepherd were not present for the meeting. There were five members and seven + guests at the meeting.

The minutes of the previous meeting and the treasurer's report were both approved by a vote on a motion made by Jackie Frazier and Debbie Glutz.

The police report was given by Officer Germaine Love and Sgt. Rodney Pompey. California incurred no reported offences for the month of January. This is the third month in a row that the crime rate in California has been ZERO. Congratulations to the entire community for their efforts made and watching out for each other. They reminded us of the Captains Resource Meeting to be February 13th at JP Parker School. Hilda is planning on attending that meeting.

The fire report was presented by Firefighter Powers. While there had been 41 runs made by the engine company, none of those were made to the California area. Again, this speaks well of our little corner of the world. He reminded the members of the importance avoiding electrical fire hazards (i.e., not overloading outlets, space heater safety, extension cords, etc.).

Mandy from CRC put in a request to replace the beeping smoke alarm in our building and apologized for forgetting the flag, flagpole and stand.

Old Business

NSP/NBD programs

Dave announced that the NSP program funding has been approved and that the NBD program funding was up for review/funding on the 13th.

Dave indicated that we may be talking about the hiring for the contracts for NSP/NBD at the next meeting and that we should begin talking about spring cleanup in the community.

New Business

Jackie Frazier received a call from a company that does video of older structures in communities. She will have information from them at the next meeting.

Denny Mullen with California community Church announced that they have been nominated for a monetary prize for small and rural churches from district conference. Good luck to them.

There was discussion regarding the recent change to one of our streets in the community. Linneman Street between Eldorado and Waits Avenue was made into a one way street. There was concern about traffic issues with this change. Dave indicated that he was notified by a property owner on the street about his desire for the change due to the narrow street. Dave has requested information from the city on the process for the change, thinking the CCC would be requested to comment or at least be officially notified. Dave has not yet received a response from the Director of Transportation – Michael Moore. There is hope that we will have a response by next meeting.

With no further business before the council, the meeting was adjourned by a motion made by Jackie Frazier and seconded by Debbie Glutz.
