

Officer Pompey and Officer Butler addressed resident concerns regarding speeding on Eldorado Avenue. Suggestions were police motorcycle patrols and speed bumps. This will be reviewed for implementation. They also had a page handout about steps to take during the holidays to stay safe and protect your belongings.

Mandy Bello with Cincinnati Recreation Centers announced that was a town hall meeting scheduled at Mt.
