LAST TRIP TO MONTPELIER

Yes, I think this will be our last trip to Montpelier, Vt. Not that it is a bad trip just that we have been there so many times and being small there isn't anything else to do while there.

After 10 months of chemo treatment Charles and, I too, needed some time away from it. They didn't say remission yet but the CT scans look good and keep an eye on it. We both decided when he was feeling better we would get away for a few days. Since we had heard that Montpelier was having heir annual 4th of July Parade, we thought this is the right time. It is a 16 hr trip, each way, but no problem for us as I know the way by heart. Jeannette, our museum director, informed us of the parade and thought it would be good for him to be honored and ride in the special convertible used for this occasion. Also there would not be any other W.W. 2 vet there from the U.S.S. Montpelier CL-57. He had the front seat with a banner that read "U.S.S. Montpelier CL-57, W.W. 2 Vet. All along the route he was honored, praised and thanked for his service to our great country. Now you can see how important this could be for him after the last several months. The parade lasted 2 hrs. or more and had an attendance of 8 to 10,000 people along the route. This is the biggest event for the city of Montpelier.

Much to our surprise, thinking we were the only ones to represent the navy and the Montpelier ships, wrong. After meeting at the starting point we were met by two young handsome sailors sent by the submarine Montpelier to represent them, since it is now serving in East Asia. Also we were met by the captain's wife and son, waving flags and wearing caps of the sub. Suddenly we noticed a navy officer pushing a stroller with a young son and daughter beside her. She was the wife of the Exec. Officer aboard the boat. Needless to say she was a Lieutenant in the Navy and a helicopter pilot. The baby was not with her, she had 3 children under the age of 5, what a dedicated person she is. Can you picture keeping up with all that? They flew up from Norfolk into New Hampshire and drove here for the parade.

The Cincinnati Police Department utilizes the CitizenObserver.Com program to keep residents aware of on-going and unsolved criminal events in individual neighborhoods throughout the City of Cincinnati.

Residents can sign-up for these alerts by following these simple steps:

1. Log on to www.CitizenObserver.Com
 - a. Click on **SIGN UP FOR ALERTS**
 - b. Enter all your basic contact information.
2. Check the **RECEIVE ALERTS** box for **EMAIL**
3. If you want alerts sent as a text message to your cell phone, check **SMS**
4. Click **NEXT** and select the Law Enforcement Agency you want to receive alerts from:
 - a. Select **CINCINNATI POLICE**
 - b. Select **DISTRICT 2**
5. Click on the **NEXT** page and select your neighborhood for Neighborhood Watch Alerts – Do not sign up as a Block Watch Captain, only a member.

Email alerts will come to your email account within minutes of their being sent by Police Department Investigators.

their blankets on the grounds of the state capital building to be ready for the fireworks after the parade. We opted out and headed back up on top of the hill and thought we might be able to see them from there, but the weather wasn't very good. The weather all the while was lousy and rainy but it didn't stop things.

The first night of our trip we spent in Utica, N.Y. on Rt. 90, which follows along the route of the old Erie Canal. In fact our motel was built right along the canal and you could see remains of it. Lots of early history has been written about by James Fenimore Cooper when he wrote the Leather stocking series - Drums on the Mohawk and The Last of the Mohicans. Most of the homes up in this area are large and very old, even in Montpelier itself. Not much growth in housing industry and very few apartments. It is 860 miles up each way, Vermont only has one interstate and it goes from north to south. Very beautiful country, almost reminds you of being in the Alps. It was a very enjoyable trip and a much needed one,
