

November 11, 2008 7:30 P.M.**

Call to Order:

The meeting opened with The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag led by Krystal Alsept. Roll call of officers found Treasurer Kathleen Chandler and Mike Christ absent.

Minutes:

Motion was made by Hilda Davenport to suspend the reading of October's meeting minutes, seconded by Jackie Frazier, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report:

Secretary David Ross read the Treasurer's report. Hilda Davenport made a motion to accept, seconded by Joey Shepherd, motion passed.

Police Report:

Officer Kelly MacBeth gave the police report. Officer MacBeth and Community Officer Germain Love provided a police report. There were 4 thefts in the month of October. Fire Report:

There was no fire report.

Guests:

Mary Cox, new director of the Mt. Washington Recreation Center, mentioned that the MWRC will hold a "Breakfast with Santa" on Saturday, December 13th at 9:00 am. Mary can be contacted by calling the center or email at mary.cox@cincinnati-oh.gov.

Crista Criddle from City of Cincinnati Councilman Chris Monzel's office answered questions and offered assistance. The following issues were mentioned: Potholes on Apple Hill Road, number of illegal u-turns on Kellogg at I-275 interchange, no speed limit sign in front of Radel Funeral Home west-bound Kellogg Avenue (pole in place but no sign), 'no parking' signs along Waits are missing, trash around Riverstar Ballpark (possibly a work program could work on this), and Amanda Huber noted the extremely slow response time for her 911 call when going into labor. Call 591-6000 when setting out large items of trash on collection day.

Old Business:

Discussed NSP and NBD projects for 2009. Dave Ross mentioned that we historically use the funds for maintenance

of streetscape, entry sign areas, community park as well as produce the newsletter and assist with some expenses at Ebersole. This year we also worked on a community website. We will vote on projects at December's meeting.

Discussed election of 2009 officers. Krystal Alsept has moved out of town (although she will continue to own and operate Lexis Pitstop) and will not be running for President. Diana Weir also indicated that she will not be running for Vice-President although she would still have an interest in a Board of Governor's position. Secretary David Ross indicated that he would be interested in the President position for 2009. Kathy Chandler has indicated that she will continue as Treasurer. David said he will be approaching other past members for interest in positions. Elections will take place at December's meeting.

Website status report. Graphic Designer Lisa Kuethe is in progress with the design of the community website. It will be able to be added to over the years but will have the basic framework and information in by the end of the year. The in-progress site can be viewed at www.CaliforniaOhio.org.

New Business:

This year's children's holiday party will be Sunday, December 14th at 3:00 at Ebersole Center, Lexis Pit Stop will sponsor gifts and snacks.

Discussion issued about the potential to eventually phase out the printed newsletter, since it will be available electronically on the new website and/or could be emailed out. Concerns were expressed about individuals would do not have web access. It was decided to continue with full newsletter as in the past for 2009 but to start to request email address for potential email distribution. We will also use the year to discuss and get feedback on the issue. The goal would also be to include agenda items for upcoming meetings on the website.

With no further business before the council, Bess Carnes made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Joey Shepherd, motion passed. Meeting Adjourned.
